Africana Publishing in St. Petersburg, Russia: Espace Européen

MANSA-member Konstantin Pozdnakov of the Institute of Ethnology at the Academy of Sciences in St. Petersburg is the Chief Editor of a new publishing house, ESPACE EUROPÉEN. This is a joint-venture with some French participation, and they are particularly interested in publishing Africana, including books in African languages. One of their forthcoming projects is an illustrated story in Bamanakan to be marketed in Mali.

According to Valentin Vydrin, if anyone is interested in having their book translated into Russian and published in St. Petersburg, it is presently possible to have the translation done at the rate of \$1 per page, with publication done for a similarly moderate sum. Vydrin now estimates between \$1000 and \$1500 for a book of 300 pages. These prices may apply for a relatively short time, owing to the changing economic situation in Russia.
